**Art Club    Advisor: Mrs. Gumbrecht  
(Cycle 1 & 2 -7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade) - (Cycle 3 & 4 – 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Grade)**

Meeting Day: Tuesday    Location: Art Room

*Description: This club opportunity allows students to explore art as they further develop their skills and creativity in an after school setting. Students will create various art projects under the direction of their art teacher/advisor.*

*Description: The 7<sup>th</sup> /8<sup>th</sup> Grade Student Council is a student government organization whose goal is to contribute to the quality and welfare of Edgar Middle School. Students plan and participate in school dances, spirit days, and other student led activities. Club members also serve as guides for visitors to the school at evening events such as Parent/Teacher Conferences and Meet the Teachers Night. Various activities sponsored by the Student Council act as rallying points to help achieve the Council's goals.*

*Description: Chess Club is a place where students who enjoy chess can get together and play. It is also a place where students of any ability level may join including newcomers who want to learn how to play chess in a low-pressure environment. The club holds one-two chess tournaments per year for any interested participants. Strategy Games Club runs for the last few weeks of Chess Club. Students play a variety of strategy games such as Risk, Stratego, and Clue.*

*Description: The Environmental Club is a service organization that is dedicated to maintaining and improving the plant and animal habitats around Edgar Middle School. We primarily focus on the Edgar Courtyard and Edgar Woods. The Edgar Courtyard is currently certified as a National Wildlife Federation Schoolyard Habitat and is used as an outdoor classroom. Club members help in maintaining this habitat throughout the school year by weeding, planting, watering, maintaining pond water quality, caring for turtles and fish, composting, and monitoring bird feeders. Within the Courtyard, we also plan, plant, and harvest vegetables and herbs in a small garden. Club members help monitor the health of Edgar Woods, and annually conduct a clean-up for Earth Day. The Club is also dedicated to participating in environmental concerns that concern the students. Past projects have focused on increasing paper recycling and use of reusable water bottles.*

*Description: The club serves to expose its members to the rich Spanish and Latin American cultures through art, food, music, games and language. Membership is open to students in grades 5 through 8. In addition to regular meetings, club members participate in a field trip or special activity that offers an opportunity to experience Spanish culture.*

Club members brainstorm topics at their editorial meetings and develop ideas for the school newspaper. Research activities, creative writing, interviewing, photography, and paper layout are included in the production of the school newspaper. Membership is open to all students in grade 5 through 8.*

*Description: Students participate in all aspects of organizing and developing the School Yearbook. The production of the yearbook includes using an on-line program. Students are also trained in Photoshop for digital photography and the Josten's Yearbook production program. Club participants oversee all aspects of production of the EMS yearbook. Membership is open to all students in grades 6 through 8.*

*Description: The Digital Photography and Computer Club is open to all students in grades 5 through 8 with an interest in photography and technology. Previous experience with cameras is not required. Students may bring their own camera or use one of the school's cameras when possible. The club allows students to explore digital photography, photography editing and enhancement techniques, as well create projects displaying their photographs. Students will also be able to explore computer programs such as SMART, Publisher, and Google platforms.*

*Description: This is a reading club that encourages students to read as it promotes a spirit of healthy competition. *Description: The club will build upon and expand topics covered in the regular science curriculum. The club affords students the opportunity to delve deeper and learn more about topics that interest them. We will be conducting experiments in Biology, Physics, Chemistry and Earth Science. Students will use engineering design principles to find solutions to specific problems. Students will build prototypes and test their performance. Additionally, other aspects of the production may include programs, publicity, and concessions.*

*Description: Breaking the Chain Through Education Inc. aims to eradicate child slave trafficking in impoverished regions of Ghana through a variety of approaches.
